

THE UGANDA BALL

The Brilliant Social Event of Last Night

Given in Honor of Governor Budd and State Officers.

People From Many Portions of the State Were There.

The Handsome Capitol Building Beautifully Decorated—Some Elegant Ball Costumes and Who Were There.

The inaugural ball given at the Capitol last night by the citizens of Sacramento in honor of Governor Budd and the newly-elected State officers was a brilliant affair, in which many leading society and other portions of the State participated.

Ever since Sacramento became the Capital of the State it has been the custom of her citizens to honor each incoming administration in this manner, and these inaugural balls have always been looked forward to with joyful anticipation by society people here and elsewhere.

The interior of the Capitol building never looked prettier than it did last night, despite the short time the committee on Decorations had in which to effect the transformation. But modern decorators can accomplish much in a couple of days, as the results of their labors revealed last night.

The weather, too, was on its good behavior—a typical Sacramento midwinter night. Not a cloud obscured the sky, and the high north wind of the previous night had been succeeded by soft and gentle breezes from the south.
