THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE City of Sacramento will meet as a City Board of Equalization on the Monday in July, MONDAY, July 1, 1895, at 1 o'clock P. M., to examine the assessment book and equalize the assessment of property in the city, and will continue in session for that purpose from time to time until the business of equalization is disposed of no later than the third Monday in July, 1895.

THAT FRIDAY, JULY THE 5TH, 1895, at 10 o'clock A. M., is set for hearing of the report of the Viewers on said petition by the Board of Supervisors of Sacramento County, at their office on I street, between Sixth and Seventh streets, Sacramento City, California.
