

CALIFORNIA FRUIT FOR LONDON.

Regular Weekly Shipments to Be Made From Sacramento.

The First is Now on Its Way—A London Dealer Promises a Good Market and Good Prices.

George H. Appel, agent of the California Fruit Transportation Company, states that the first shipment of the season, consisting of choice selected California fruit, was forwarded yesterday by special train via the Central Pacific, Union Pacific, Chicago and Northwestern and Erie roads.

This shipment consists of pears, peaches and plums from the orchards of D. H. Osborn, Courtland; George Carls, Clarkburg; S. M. Doty, Courtland; J. Z. Anderson, Fruit Company; Joe Green, Courtland; F. Bogt, Courtland; R. D. Stephens and A. B. Humphrey of Mayhew's, and the National Fruit Association.

In a letter from Mr. White of W. N. White & Co., London, under date of June 28th, Mr. Appel states that positive information respecting the crops from all parts of England and the continent of the British Isles is to say with certainty that the crop of pears in England, France and everywhere else on the continent generally is the worst they have had for a number of years.
