UPHILL BUSINESS IN CALIFORNIA.

Railroad Expenses Here Compared With Those East.

This Time It is Not the So-Called "Octopus" That Asks for Fair Treatment.

President A. W. Foster and Secretary and Controller Thomas Mellers of the San Francisco and North Pacific Railroad appeared before the State Board of Equalization yesterday in support of a request to reduce the company's assessment to 10 per cent.

Mr. Mellers said that the mileage is the same as last year and the earnings and expenses so similar to those of the preceding year, that little reason could be offered for comment thereon.

The passenger earnings were considerably less than for the years 1892 and 1893, which were years of depression...

It is thus seen, said Mr. Mellers, that the San Francisco and North Pacific Railroad pays over four times as much for coal as do the roads in the Middle States...
