A PREVENTIBLE DISEASE.

Precautions to be Taken Against Cholera.

Information Given Out by San Francisco's Health Officer, Dr. Lovelace.

At a meeting of physicians from various parts of the State, held in San Francisco a few days ago, Dr. Lovelace, Health Officer of San Francisco, said: "Cholera is an absolutely preventable disease.

The directions of which Dr. Lovelace spoke are as follows: Cholera is not contagious in the same sense that scarlet fever and smallpox are contagious; it is not what is commonly called "catching."
