

COREAN TROUBLES.

Belief That the Disorders Have Come to an End.

REPORT OF THE QUEEN'S ASSASSINATION DOUBTED.

Millions of Tons of Fruit Going to Waste Along the Ohio River Because of the Close of Navigation.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.—The Japanese Legation has no information to-day respecting the troubles in Corea, and the officials here believe that the disorders have ceased and that nothing further will occur to affect the domestic peace of the kingdom.

Thirteen years ago Tai-Won-Kun, the father of the King, led an assault on the palace, with the declared purpose of killing his daughter-in-law. The latter was reported as having been slain, and color was given to this impression by her disappearance from the palace.
