

FRANCE'S NEW MINISTRY.

Premier Bourgeois Outlines the Government's Policy.

SOUTHERN RAILWAY SCANDALS TO BE INQUIRED INTO.

Senators and Members of the Chamber to be Prohibited From Holding Positions as Directors of Any Company Having Contracts With the State Under Penalty of Losing Their Seats.

PARIS, Nov. 4.—At 3:15 o'clock this afternoon Premier Bourgeois began reading the declaration of policy of the Ministry in the Chamber of Deputies. The radical Deputies cheered the Premier repeatedly, but the members of the Centre remained frigidly silent throughout the address.

M. Bourgeois also said it was the intention of the Government to prohibit all members of the Chamber of Deputies from holding positions as directors of any company having contracts with the State, under the penalty of losing their seats.

With reference to the army, he said the Government would give satisfaction to the desire of the nation for a perfect organization and supervision of its troops. He congratulated the troops in Madagascar upon their admirable march to Antananarivo, and said that France had acquired alliances which established the universal equilibrium.

The Government, he announced, would support a bill for the imposition of a progressive tax on the inheritance of real estate, and to entirely correct the anti-democratic inequalities in the finance system by a general income tax.

They would also defend bills relating to co-operative insurance, to organize a system of workmen's pensions, and would prepare a definite settlement of the relations between the State and the State. The Government, he said, did not intend to interfere with the economic regime but would merely ask that measures be passed which would protect the agriculturists against certain international speculations, and to regulate international speculations in gold mines.

M. Bourgeois expressed his belief that a Republican majority existed in the Chamber, and that it was his duty to demand the confidence of the Chamber for the Government, not that it might live, but that it might act.

DEATH OF A JOURNALIST.

Eugene Field Suddenly Expires at His Home in Chicago.

CHICAGO, Nov. 4.—Eugene Field, poet, journalist and story writer, died at his home at Buena Park early this morning as the result of heart failure. For some days Mr. Field had been ailing, but it was supposed he was suffering from his usual stomach troubles, and no serious turn was anticipated. Dr. Frank Reilly, who was summoned this morning, pronounced the death to have been caused by the formation of a clot of blood in the heart.

Although Mr. Field was feeling so ill that he telegraphed to Kansas City canceling an engagement that he had there for to-night, he sat up until a late hour, and then he lay on his back, and he died peacefully at 12:30 o'clock. He was 52 years of age.

Upon going to bed Mr. Field did not complain, but during the night he was awakened by his father's groaning in his sleep. He went to the room of Mr. Field, and found him lying on his back, and he was dead. The heat of life had not yet died out, and a tranquil, peaceful expression was on his face.

Mr. Field first took to his bed last Thursday. Up to yesterday he had expected to keep his engagement at Kansas City, but last night he told his brother, Roswell M. Field, to telegraph his inability to make the trip, and that he would be unable to give the promised reading in the Kansas City Auditorium.

Mr. Field leaves a widow and five children, two daughters and three sons. The eldest child is Miss Mary French Field, 19 years of age, and the youngest is scarcely 12 months old. The funeral will take place Wednesday and the interment will be at Grace-land.
