San Francisco, May 18th. Spot Wheat is lower, but quotations are nominal; the light demand that is on for chicken feed; a cargo of 58,000 centals is down from Port Costa for Europe.

Butter and Cheese are unchanged; the former steady, and the latter easy. Eggs appear to be steady, but it is a steadiness that will not last.
