SHIPPING WHEAT NOMINAL AT QUOTATIONS.

Barley Steady—Oats Quite Firm—Trading Not Very Active—Flour Rather Quiet.

San Francisco, June 4th. Flour is rather quiet at prices that have not changed for a long time. About the only wheat that is changing hands is Chickens Feed. Shipping wheat is nominal at the quotations. Barley is steady; some choice Bright Feed brings 73c. Oats are quite firm; trading is not very active; there are very few Gray Oats here. Corn is dull and prices are tending downward. Rye is dull and lower. Asparagus, Peas and Rhubarb are weak. The amount of Rhubarb received was not large, but consumers have had sufficient and consequently it drags. Peas are not wanted. Bay Squash sells well. Potatoes and Onions are quite steady. Green Cakes have made their appearance, but are too green and are unsold. Apricots are firm; receipts were lighter. Blackberries were received from Fresno to-day; those heretofore received were from Los Angeles County. Oranges for shipping purposes are in fair demand, but for local use the demand is slow. Lemons are firm. Occasional sales of Fancy Creamery are made above the top quotation; the market is about steady at the moment, and appearances point toward an easier feeling; the butter arriving is in good shape, but the quality has been affected by the heat. Cheese continues weak, with some Fancy New sales at a slight advance. The game as previously quoted; Choice Ranch appear firmer; the demand, generally, is slow.

Yesterday's car of Eastern Poultry is all cleaned up; another car will be here next Monday. There is a slight better feeling in California stock, but prices generally do not advance. Old Geese are not wanted at all, some go for 75c.
