Fitting Out One of the Transatlantic Flyers.

About 100,000 Articles Are Required for the Comfort of Passengers and Crew.

The task of fitting out a vessel like the St. Louis or St. Paul is simply enormous. No less than 100,000 articles must be purchased and put in place.

It is here that the analogy between furnishing a house and a vessel stops.

Of course it could not be expected that the management of the American line should reveal what it costs to fit out such a vessel as the St. Louis or St. Paul.

Here are some of the articles and the quantity required in a general way such a ship as one of the new American

liners. For the first cabin alone, there must be 3,000 spoons, 2,000 forks, 1,000 knives, 5,000 spoons, 500 tumbler, lewis, 300 salt cellars, 2,000 tumblers, 1,000 cups and 1,000 saucers, 6,000 plates of various kinds, 12,000 napkins.

It is the custom of English shipbuilders to supply the furnishings as well as to construct the vessel.

But the supplies do not stop with the fittings and fixtures. The kitchen and pantry implements required for these departments contains hundreds of items.

A ship like one of the new liners frequently carries 1,500 persons across the ocean. There is probably no hotel in the world that frequently has any such number of guests for a week at a time.

When it comes to food and drink the ingenuity of the port steward of the line and the steward of the ship is exercised. It is customary on all ocean steamships for the stewards to keep an accurate account of all articles used from day to day.
