Statistics of electric lighting in Japan to the end of 1895, not including any isolated plants, are as follows, says the "Electrical Engineer": There are thirty-one electric lighting companies, eight of which use water power and the others steam; the total number of incandescent lamps is 80,150, or reduced to their equivalent in eight candle power lamps, nearly all of which are of 1,200 candle power, is 420.
