Offerings of Barley Large and Prices Downward—Oats and Corn Quiet.

San Francisco, Aug. 18th. Wheat is brisk at previous prices for shipping, and milling is moving very slowly at easier prices.

Potatoes in large supply and weak, except Salinas Burbanks; river stock is weak. Onions show a weaker feeling.

There is the same glut of fruit as heretofore, and no sale for the majority of it, and much will be given away. Berries are weak, and only choice Bartlett Pears sell.

Butter is weak, and the demand very slow for all kinds. Good supply of Cheese, but not enough to lower prices.
