THE LOCAL WHEAT MARKET STRONGER.

Further Decline in Barley and Nothing Doing in Oats or Corn.

San Francisco, Aug. 21st. Encouraged by better Eastern and foreign markets the local wheat market is stronger; futures are active and firmer; spot values are advanced, but trading is still slow.

Each day brings a large amount of fruit and low and uncertain prices. The market will probably be relieved in a week or so and prices strengthened.

No change in dairy products. Plenty of butter for all needs, but most of it second grade; fancy is firm. Fancy Ranch Eggs rising a little, but prices quoted are not higher.
