

NOW COME THE BANGTAILS.

Thoroughbreds Entered for the Running Races.

Some Events Not Yet Closed—The Park and Track in Good Condition.

Yesterday the "Record-Union" published the trotting and pacing entries for the State Fair races that begin on Tuesday next.

It will be seen that the races are starting well, insuring large fields of fillers and exciting contests.

The Park has been put in apple-pie order for the fair by Superintendent J. E. Terry, and never looked neater nor better in any way.

The contract for the official speed programme this year has been awarded to Joe Laugenderfer, and no other so-called programme will be official nor complete.

So far as expressions of opinion have been heard, the action of the State Society in leaving the betting ring open to competition among all bookmakers who may desire to set up their blocks—and pay for them, of course—is indorsed generally.

Last year one man had the privilege, and he offered only such odds as he chose, but under the present system the rival bookmakers will compete for the nimble dollar and better terms may reasonably be expected.
