WHEAT, BOTH FOR SPOT AND FUTURES, HIGHER.

Barley Quite Dull - Trading Oats Slow - Receipts Light and Prices Firm.

San Francisco, Sept. 14th. Wheat is firm, both spot and futures are higher; three cargoes, amounting to over 150,000 centals, are down from Port Costa for export. Barley is quite dull; 3 1/2c is a full figure for feed. No changes in Oats; trading is slow, receipts are light and prices are firm. No improvement in Corn, either as to demand or prices. The Fruit trade in general is dragging. Receipts are more than ample for the limited demand and sales are forced, with concessions being made to clean up. Of course there are exceptions of a day now and then when a particular fruit will be light and bring better prices for the time. 70-day's receipts were not heavy, but there was considerable carried over, particularly Apples. Very few Berries arrived to-day; large Strawberries were higher; not enough Longworths arrived to quote. Grapes are weak; Isabelias are now quite plentiful and lower. Butter is easy at the quotations. The receipt in the neighborhood of 500 boxes from northern counties, mostly Creamery, will weaken the market considerably. As previously stated, the Eggs situation seems improved and better prices are noted; the outside figure for Ranch is an extreme.
