

DOUBLE FOREST FIRES IN THE SIERRA MADRES.

Huge Sheets of Flame Seen From Pasadena.

The Conflagration Extends Over Twenty-Five Miles.

People Fleeing From Its Wrath Into the Valleys Below With Their Property—Inanimate Target Association's Shoot at San Jose—Aged Couple Injured—Three Desperate Crooks Give Battle to Constables, But One is Captured.

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 4.—The double forest fires in the Sierra Madres are increasing in magnitude every hour. The greatest apprehension is felt for the safety of the Echo Mountain House, Alpine Tavern and other property of the Mount Lowe Company, though they were yesterday thought to be safely outside the danger line.

Returning fire-fighters and others from the scene of the conflagrations report having witnessed a sight which they can never forget. The blaze at times was a hundred feet above the tree tops, while fire brands and blazing branches filled the air in every direction, forming such a combination of eddying, whirling and rolling masses, so intermingled with haze, spark and coals as to afford a spectacle at once weird, brilliant and sublime.

As Rector of the Catholic University of America.

It Was Done at the Request of the Pope.

He is Elevated to the Rank of Archbishop and Elects to Remain in This Country—States That He Has Long Wanted to be Relieved of His Duties, as He Was Failing, But Did Not Wish to Ask to be Relieved From His Post.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 4.—Bishop Keane, rector of the Catholic University, has resigned at the request of Pope Leo XIII.

Without a moment of hesitation I accept the will of your holiness in this matter as a manifestation of the providence of God, and from this instant I resign into the hands of his eminence, the Chancellor, the office of rector with all rights thereto attached.
