FLOUR FIRM, WITH STRONG UPWARD TENDENCY.

Wheat Has Been Further Advanced, Both for Spot and Futures—Barley Higher.

San Francisco, Oct. 13th. Flour is firm, with a strong upward tendency. Wheat has been further advanced, both spot and futures; very little offering in the sample market. Barley has followed the lead of wheat, and all descriptions are higher; as high as \$2.40 was paid for a small lot of bright feed. Offerings of Oats are very limited and an advance is noted; there are practically none but feed Oats here. Rye is very firm at a further advance; very little offering. Berries arrived more freely to-day and are weak; Strawberries are lower. Good Apples sell well; there are quite a lot of wormy and inferior stock here; Spitzenbergs are arriving. Very few Pigs here. Grapes are weaker for table varieties. Peaches are scarce and better prices are quoted. Light receipts of Quinces. Fancy Winter Nuts are scarce and firm. Fancy Dairy Butter is advanced, but other kinds are quoted as heretofore. Prices have reached a point where buyers do not take hold until forced to do so. In all cases there is a demand for the market for mild new is about enough to keep stocks from accumulating. Eggs appear easier, except for best specimens, which are doing well. Ranch Eggs, however, are shaded somewhat for the general run, although occasionally sales are made above the outside figure.
