THOMAS O'BRIEN'S WILL.

His Estate Bequeathed to the Members of His Family.

The will of the late Thomas O'Brien has been filed in the Clerk's office, and his son, Thomas F. O'Brien, has petitioned the Superior Court to admit it to probate.

The real estate consists of twelve blocks of land within the city, the estimated value of which is \$24,000, and about forty acres north of the north levee, valued at \$2,000.

In his will the deceased names his wife, Annie, and his sons, Thomas F. and William T. O'Brien, as his executors, without bonds, to administer his estate.

The property is to be disposed of as follows after all debts are paid: His wife, Annie O'Brien, is to receive \$5,000 out of the estate and \$2,500 on his life insurance policy.

All the residue of the property is given in equal shares to his five sons and daughter-Thomas F., William R., George H., Fred L. and Frank S. O'Brien, and Mrs. Mary J. Sheehan, wife of Maurice H. Sheehan.
