

A GOOD WOMAN GONE.

Death of Mrs. Frank L. Orcutt From Appendicitis.

The many friends of Mr. and Mrs. F. L. Orcutt were painfully shocked yesterday on learning of the latter's death, which occurred at an early hour in the morning at her home on H street.

It was only on Wednesday that a severe attack of appendicitis compelled her to call in medical aid, and the usual operation was performed in the hope of saving her life. But she never rallied from the shock to her nervous system.

Mrs. Orcutt was a niece of Irving M. Scott, President of the Union Iron Works Company of San Francisco. She was born in Baltimore County, Maryland. She was a woman of generous heart and was prominent in many local charities, being a member of the Protestant Orphan Asylum Board of Managers. In society circles here and at San Francisco she was also prominent, and her death will be mourned by a very wide circle of friends.

The old ladies of the Marguerite Home have caused the flag of the institution to be displayed at half mast out of respect for Mrs. Orcutt.

Mrs. Orcutt leaves, besides her husband, two young daughters, who have the sympathy of the community in their sorrow.
