

THE YOUNG MEN'S INSTITUTE.

How the Local Councils Honored Washington's Birthday.

Patriotic Songs and Recitations—Interesting Address by Hon. H. E. Highton.

The second celebration of Y. M. I. Day by Sacramento Council, No. 17, and Capitol Council, No. 27, Young Men's Institute, which was held in the Metropolitan Theater last evening, proved an unqualified success in every particular.

James Doody in a few introductory remarks touched a responsive chord, and after extending a hearty welcome to the audience retired with applause ringing in his ears.

Major Anderson paid a high tribute to the memory of the Father of His Country, Militant at Marathon, Washington at Yorktown and Grant at Appomattox.

Two changes only occurred in the published programme, the first of which was the absence of Rich. T. Cohn, whose place was acceptably filled by Walter Longbottom, who rendered "Let Me Like a Soldier Fall," and was the recipient of round after round of applause.

Thomas W. Hebron rendered "The Curse of Regulus" in fine style, and being recalled, put his audience in fine fettle by his inimitable rendition of "Casey at the Bat."

Hon. Henry E. Highton of San Francisco, the orator of the evening, was well received, and his address on "Patriotism" was punctuated throughout with applause.

He quoted from Washington's inaugural address to show that the father of his country openly and officially recognized the power of divine omnipotence and realized and acknowledged that patriotism and religion were one and the same.

Patriotism, the speaker said, is an elastic word, varying in meaning in different epochs and among different people. The word "patriotism" had, in the United States, acquired a deeper, wider meaning than it had ever before had. It meant an extending of the blessings of life to the nation.
