COMMISSIONER TO THE PARIS EXPOSITION.

The President will be called upon to appoint a citizen of the United States to represent this country as its Commissioner at the International World's Exposition at Paris in 1900.

The Administration will do itself credit and appoint a thoroughly qualified man by commissioning to that important office M. H. de Young of San Francisco.

Mr. De Young is one of the best known men in the United States in connection with matters relating to great exhibitions.

It is common knowledge that Mr. De Young during his service in these trusts made a study of all details, economic and otherwise, of exposition work and its relation to the country at large, its industries and its production.

While it will be of great advantage to the country at large to have a Commissioner of this order at the Paris Exposition, it will be especially advantageous to California that one of her own citizens should be chosen.

We have said this of Mr. De Young without his knowledge, and without any assurance that he is desirous of assuming the weighty obligations such a commission will involve.

A CITY CENSUS. The late Legislature passed and the Governor has approved an Act authorizing any city of this State at any time between the years for the taking of the Federal census to have the census of such city taken.

The State law requires that the school census of the city shall be taken in this month, April, under the direction of the Board of Education.

It will be entirely proper for the City Trustees and the Board of Education to name the same marshals and have the census taken in full, not of children alone.

DAVID LUBIN'S PLAN. Declared to be Dangerously Near Free Trade.

The New York "Evening Post" editorially comments on David Lubin's plan as follows: David Lubin and his associated grangers of California, Oregon, Washington, Illinois, Missouri, Virginia and Pennsylvania are still pushing their bill for the payment of bounties on the export of agricultural produce.

The price in the foreign market fixes the price in the home market. "Selling the surplus as we do at international prices," says the memorial, "compels us to sell the greater quantity for home use at the same price, for the export and the home price is always the same."

The great advantage of this plan is that it would give to the farmer much more money than it would take from the treasury. Mr. Lubin and his associates show that the cost to the Government of the proposed bounties on wheat, cotton and corn would be only \$41,000,000 per annum.

The abolition of the protective tariff as a means for the protection of manufactures would do away with the claims for protection by an export bounty, but so long as moneys are received on imports for the protection of manufactures, these moneys, or a portion thereof, should be paid out primarily, not for Government expenses, but for export bounties to protect the staples of agriculture, and thus equalize protection by extending it to agriculture as well as to manufactures.
