ORDINANCE NO. 50.

SECTION 1. ON THIS 6th DAY of April, 1897, coming on regularly for hearing by the Board of Supervisors of the county of Sacramento, State of California, the application of the California Transportation Company, for authorization to construct and maintain a wharf as set forth in said application and satisfactory proof of the same, and the filing of said application as required by law having been made to the board on the 5th day of March, 1897, and in accordance with the hearing of said application, and upon the request of the applicant, the granting of the authorization to construct and maintain a wharf was continued and an appeal appearing in the name of Supervisors that the public good and convenience will be promoted. Supervisors of said county of Sacramento do ordain as follows:

That there is granted to the California Transportation Company, its successors and assigns, the right to construct and maintain a wharf on the land of the said California Transportation Company situated and being in the city of Sacramento, in the southwest corner of Swamp Land Survey No. 303 and in the southeast corner of Swamp Land Survey No. 294 in the said county of Sacramento. Said wharf to extend into deep water and to be not more than 200 feet in length nor more than 50 feet in width. The said applicant is hereby also granted the right to take tolls and wharf dues for the use of said wharf, for the term of twenty years.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 41 and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its legal publication.
