THE PROFITS OF THE SUGAR BEET INDUSTRY.

The Farmers' Institute on last Friday in Santa Rosa had under consideration the question of the establishment of a beet sugar factory in that city.

One of the valuable suggestions of the occasion was that an association of local capitalists establish the factory.

The local campaign develops daily increase of strength in the candidacy of William Land for Mayor, and increasing confidence in the whole Republican ticket.

The beet sugar industry is in its infancy, and, as suggested at the Farmers' Institute at Santa Rosa, now is an opportune time to form associations of local capital for working the beets into sugar.

When the beets are grown and produced at the factory, all the risk of the undertaking has been incurred—the risk of short crop, of drought, of incompatible soil, of percentage of saccharine to be found in the product, and thus when all these risks have been incurred, the beets are sold on the basis of a raw material value.

The agricultural feature of this partnership carries the risk and receives the smallest share of the profits. There is no gainsaying these propositions. The beet sugar enterprise as proposed here is worthy of consideration.


