Fresno Republican: The Selma Farmers' Club starts out with good membership and is now preparing to look after the interests of agriculture in that locality. There is no more useful organization than a well-constituted farmers' club and every agricultural center should have one.

PROSPEROUS KANSAS. San Diego Sun: The report from Kansas of an increase in bank deposits aggregating nearly ten millions and a total deposit equal to \$30 per capita for the people of Kansas, is the kind of a report that has substance to it. Having those actual conditions, the people of Kansas are not bothering themselves about the matter and such the result. Having the deposits they are not waiting for the advance agent of prosperity. With an ample supply of the medium of exchange, the Kansas people are able to transact business with each other on a cash and not a credit basis, and they are happy, and all the world looks upon them and says they are prosperous.

This prosperous condition came upon Kansas as the result of the sale of wheat. The farmers there were blessed with a big crop, and they sold it at good prices. They exchanged millions of bushels of wheat for millions of gold dollars. The dollars came from people who had less need for dollars than they had for wheat. So in exchange for wheat, the people who had dollars "inflated" the financial conditions of Kansas, and brought about a condition by which the dollar is worth \$3.00.

Humboldt Standard: The "Examiner" of the 20th contains a positive statement from Governor Budd to the effect that he will not be a candidate for re-election, and that he will retire from politics entirely after the close of his present term. Whether the news may be said of Budd, he is a shrewd politician. Years ago when his famous backboard campaign got him a seat in Congress in a strong Republican district, he knew when to quit, and was not humiliated by a defeat for re-election. Under the circumstances, it is talked of as his own successor among a coterie of admiring followers. He, far shrewder than they, now sees the handwriting on the wall and will be content to retire from office when his term expires and allow some other man to do the dirty work of the polls. It is just as well that he announce now that he will not be a candidate for United States Senator against Stephen M. White; for he is not in Senator White's class.

INTERNATIONAL INFLUENCE. Oakland Enquirer: President Andrews of Brown University is a gentleman whose hold upon the public has been considerably strengthened by recent events, but it is doubtful whether it is strong enough to withstand the effects of the kind of talk which he indulged in during a recent speech in Chicago. The newspapers there report Andrews as saying: "The United States is still a colony. We might laugh at the idea, but the fact remained that from the bazaar in Downing street, America was nothing but a part of the empire. The United States was not feared in England, he said, and the fiscal policy of our country was dictated by British agents in the capital. A stronger national sentiment in the United States was necessary to preserve our traditions."
