

THE GOLDEN JUBILEE.

CELEBRATION AND FAIR IN SAN FRANCISCO. Information About the Events Which is of Interest to All Californians.

The fiftieth anniversary of the discovery of gold in California is to be celebrated on a grand scale in San Francisco next week...
