At the second day's session of the Farmers' Institute at Florin yesterday there was an increased attendance.

After several fine selections by the local Mandolin Club had been rendered Professor Hayne addressed the Institute on the subject of "Cotton Seed Oil," which he stated that at present it did not pay to make olive oil in this State, on account of the adulterations with cotton seed oil, which is so much cheaper than the olive oil can be manufactured.

E. F. French read an excellent paper on "Destructive Insects," portraying the fight he had had with them.

W. A. Mott read an interesting paper on "Vine Pruning," giving the methods he had found to give the best results.

Professor Hayne spoke on "Resistant Vines," giving some interesting information on that important subject.

Professor Wickson's address on "Strawberry Culture, Pollination," was an interesting and instructive one, as was that on "Marketing Strawberries," by J. Reese.

The Institute was decidedly a success, more than ordinary interest being taken in it.

"I would be willing to pay a typewriter almost any reasonable salary she would demand if I could only find one who could spell," waited a certain man to me not long ago, as he laid on my desk a bunch of the worst looking copy I ever saw.

Then again nearly all the writers and authors of the present day either do their own typewriting or else hire it done. These people want a girl who is quick and intelligent; one who is well read, and who can, if necessary, offer timely suggestions.

The girls who earn their own living to-day belong, in nine cases out of ten, to the steadily increasing horde of bachelor girls. The idea has often occurred to me that there ought to be in every city of any importance a clubhouse for these girls, where they could get their board and room at a reasonable rate.

I believe that in several of the larger Eastern cities such clubhouses have been tried, but they have never been successful for the reason that the good, but mistaken people having them in charge, clung tenaciously to the old-fashioned idea that the girls needed watching; in other words that a chaperone was an indispensable necessity.

It seems to me that in order to have such a club successful it should be run on the plan of a hotel or boarding-house with all of its freedom and privileges.
