The next day Kennedy again met his fishy friends, and before he got through with them they had gold watch and chain, his shoes and his new suit of clothes, and he finally concluded he had been buncoed and told his troubles to a policeman.

But the officers came along before they had a chance to work their catch, and the sharks were induced to throw up their hands.

The Street Commissioner, Dr. Nichols, has approved of the recommendation of the board, but doubted whether the funds on hand would admit of the extra expense.

Dr. Henderson further reported that he had visited the High School building, and had made an informal examination of the rooms used for chemical and physics laboratories.
