URGENT DEFICIENCY BILL.

Estimates of Appropriations Required by Navy Department. WASHINGTON, May 3.—The Secretary of the Navy has sent to the Secretary of the Treasury for transmission to Congress, to be included in the urgent deficiency bill, estimates of appropriations required by the Navy Department to complete the service of the current fiscal year, and the next fiscal year, ending June 30, 1898, amounting to \$18,480,000.
