HOUSE PROCEEDINGS. WASHINGTON, May 31.—The House to-day adopted a concurrent resolution directing the commission now codifying the criminal laws to prepare and submit a code of civil laws and procedure.

A number of private bills were passed, and the House in committee of the whole considered a bill authorizing the Secretary of the Treasury to keep open during June and July this year such life saving stations on the Atlantic and Gulf coasts as he might deem advisable.

The bill was urged by the Secretary of the Navy as providing for the continuation of the months named of an important adjunct to the naval and coast signal service in making efficient the patrol service.

After a short desultory discussion the bill was amended to carry \$70,000, instead of \$125,000, and passed.

The House at 1:35 p. m. adjourned.

JUDGMENT REVERSED. Decision of the U. S. Supreme Court in the Pullman Car Co. Suit.

WASHINGTON, May 31.—In the Supreme Court of the United States the opinion of the court below was reversed in the case of the Pullman Palace Car Company vs. the Central Transportation Company.

This case involved property amounting to about \$4,000,000 passed over to the Pullman Company by the other company under a lease made in 1870, the lease to run for ninety-nine years, and the rental to be \$240,000 per year.

The Circuit Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania gave judgment for \$4,434,034. This judgment was reversed by to-day's opinion, and the court below was instructed to enter a judgment for \$727,840, with interest from 1885, and the case was remanded to the circuit court.

Commercial Treaty. PARIS, May 31.—At the meeting of the Cabinet to-day M. Hanotaux, Minister for Foreign Affairs, announced the signing of the commercial agreement with the United States. He pointed out that the arrangement was indicative of the friendly sentiment which exists between the two countries.

British Preparing for Emergency. Section 3764 of the Political Code of California reads as follows: Section 3764. On or before the 5th day of June of each year the Tax Collector must publish the delinquent list, which must contain the names of the persons and a description of the property delinquent, and the amount of taxes, penalties and costs due, opposite each name and description, with the taxes due on personal property, the delinquent State, poll, road and hospital tax, the taxes due each school, road or other lesser territorial district added to the taxes on real estate, where the real estate is liable therefor, or the several taxes are due from the same person.

Section 3765. The Tax Collector must append and publish with the delinquent list a notice that unless the taxes delinquent, together with the costs and penalties, are paid, the real property upon which such taxes are a lien will be sold.
