HAN D'OR WINS THE LATONIA DERBY.

Gives Plaudit His First Defeat of the Season.

One of the Grandest Races Ever Run on the Western Turf.

The Time for the Mile and a Half 2:32 1/2, the Fastest Ever Made by a Three-Year-Old, and Within a Quarter of a Second of the World's Record Made by Buckwa.

CINCINNATI, June 9.—The mighty has fallen. Plaudit, the greatest three-year-old of the year, met his first defeat of the season today in the Latonia derby, after one of the grandest contests ever witnessed on the Western turf.

The track, contrary to expectations, was lightning fast, and all conditions favored good time being made. The race from a time standpoint was a most remarkable one.

The time for the mile and a half was 2:32 1/2, and 1/4 of a second slower than the world's record for the distance made by Buckwa, and the fastest time ever made by a three-year-old.

Jockey Conley, who rode the winner, was surrounded by a large crowd after he dismounted and was carried to the scale room on the shoulders of several enthusiastic friends.
