It is not absolutely necessary, as some think, to take a wheel apart to clean the bearings. They can be cleaned well enough for ordinary purposes by flushing them with kerosene.

If a rider's knees ache after riding a short time, he may be sure that the trouble is caused by too low a reach, with the saddle too far back.

One of the best methods for cleaning a chain is to boil it in a solution composed of common washing soda and water.
