NOT SATISFIED.

Santa Clara County Wants Her Tax Roll Lowered.

Santa Clara County, through its officials, recently applied for a hearing before the State Board of Equalization, respecting property values as fixed by local equalizers.

The request was granted, and yesterday a committee was forwarded to the county officials to the effect that they would be given a hearing to-morrow.

The State Board has until September 12th in which to finish the equalization of county values, and as in every instance the values fixed by Boards of Supervisors are higher than those fixed by the State Board last year, it seems probable that no citations will be made, and that the returns as made by the several County Auditors will be left unchanged.

There were a considerable quantity of clouds in the air at 5 a. m. The barometrical readings at 5 a. m. and 5 p. m. yesterday were 29.900 inches and 29.804 inches, respectively.

The highest and lowest temperatures one year ago yesterday were 75 and 54 degrees, and one year ago to-day 77 and 52 degrees.

The average temperature was 65 degrees and the normal 70 degrees, showing yesterday to have been 5 degrees cooler than usual for the 29th day of August.
