PROPOSITION.

STATE OF CALIFORNIA, Executive Department, Sacramento, July 30, 1888.

Whereas, The Legislature of the State of California, at its regular session, beginning on the Fourth day of January, A. D. 1887, two-thirds of all the members elected to each of the two houses of said Legislature voting in favor thereof, proposed the following amendments to the Constitution of the State of California, to-wit:

Amendment Number One.

(Being Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 10.)

A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution, in relation to revenue and taxation, by which it is proposed to amend said section to read as follows: Section 13. No county, city, town, township, board of education or school district shall incur any indebtedness or liability in any manner or for any purpose exceeding the amount of the income and revenue provided for it for such year, without the assent of two-thirds of the qualified electors thereof, made at an election held for that purpose, nor unless before, or at the time of incurring such indebtedness, provision shall be made for the collection of an annual tax sufficient to pay the interest thereon, and before maturity, falls due, and also provision to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof, and before maturity, which shall not exceed forty years from the time of contracting the same, provided, however, that the City and County of San Francisco may at any time pay the unpaid interest thereon, and for materials furnished to and work done on said city and county during the forty-third and forty-fourth fiscal years, the income and revenue of any succeeding year or years; provided, that any and all claims for interest on any indebtedness for any work done upon or for any materials furnished for any street, place, or sidewalk, or for the construction of any sewer or sewers in said city and county, and hereby provided that the provisions of this section;
