As to the Philippines.

Eds. "Record-Union": It is very much to be regretted that the greatest question before the American people to-day is being made a partisan issue, and that instead of the voters considering a question of such paramount importance to the future of their country quietly and impartially, they are to be asked to decide it this way or that, because it is incorporated in party platforms in one guise or another, and is to be voted upon as a Republican or Democratic measure.

The lives of nations, like those of individuals, have their periods of growth, expansion and development, and these periods can no more be eradicated from the nation's life than the growth of the child can be arrested by means that do not strike at its very vitality.

The objections to a policy of expansion seem to be first that to expand is an injustice to the present inhabitants of the new countries to be absorbed; secondly, that it is unconstitutional, and connected with this idea is that it is opposed to Washington's Farewell Address, and in contravention of the Monroe doctrine; thirdly, that it will create an imperialism at home that will lead to the overthrow of American liberty; and finally, that it will pay the nation's life that will not pay the cost of adopting it.
