

OUR GUESTS TO-MORROW.

THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF MINING ENGINEERS.

They Will Spend Several Hours Here—Reception in the State Library.

To-morrow Sacramento will have as her guests for several hours the members of the American Institute of Mining Engineers who are now visiting California and engaged in making a tour of the mines. They will leave Colfax this morning at 7:45 o'clock and arrive at Dutch Flat at 8:30. After inspecting the mines in that locality they will leave for Auburn, where they are expected to arrive at 12:30 o'clock, and become the guests at luncheon of the Placer County Miners' Association.

According to the itinerary of the party they are to leave Auburn at 2:30 p. m. and reach Sacramento at 3 o'clock. The visitors will be met at Auburn by the members of the Committee on Mines and Mining of the Chamber of Commerce—Messrs. W. D. Lawton, A. C. Hinkson, John Well and A. J. Bruner, accompanied by A. C. Herrick, who will escort them to this city.

President Frank Miller and the directors of the Chamber of Commerce will meet the visitors on their arrival here and see that they are properly entertained during their stay in the city, which will conclude about 10 p. m.

At the depot the party will take trolley cars for the Art Gallery, where they will be received and welcomed by Mayor Land, assisted by President J. A. Woodson of the Museum Association and others.

After inspecting the attractions of the Art Gallery and Museum the party will again take the cars and visit Sutter's Fort, where they will be received by President Frank D. Ryan of the Sutter Fort trustees.

Leaving the fort the party will be escorted to the Golden Eagle Hotel (about 6 o'clock), where the members will dine and take a short rest.

At 8 o'clock in the evening they will be received at the State Capitol by President Miller of the Chamber of Commerce and calls will be made on Governor Gage, Secretary of State Curry and Controller Colgan, after which they will proceed to the library, where State Librarian Gillis and other State officials, assisted by committees of ladies and gentlemen, will entertain them until the hour of departure for Oroville.

Any of the ladies of the party who may not feel like undertaking the trip to Oroville and the mines about there will be provided with accommodations at the Golden Eagle, and they can return to San Francisco by the 7 o'clock train on Monday morning.
