The front forks are subjected to a severe test in uphill riding. It is at this point that the greatest number of breakages occur. Indeed, in the two seasons, since cheaper bicycles have come so much in general use, bicycle repairers find that about one-fifth of their work comes from this source.

Two items are necessary to prevent side slipping—a well inflated tire and even pedaling. It should be noted that tandem tires, in particular, require to be pumped commensurate with the extra weight they have to carry.

A rider 85 years old has just died at Brighton, England, with a score of 18,000 miles, ridden in the last thirty years of his life.

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
