BY AUTHORITY. ACTS AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CONFEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA.

[No. 1.]
An Act to amend so much of section eleven of the Tax Law as requires one-tenth of the sweet potatoes produced this year to be paid to the Government.

[No. 2.]
An Act authorizing the tax in kind on bacon to be levied by collection of salt pork as an equivalent.

[No. 3.]
An Act to prevent the enlistment or enrolment of substitutes in the military service of the Confederate States.

[No. 4.]
Joint Resolution in relation to the Public Printing.
Resolved, by the Congress of the Confederate States of America, That in lieu of the compensation now payable to the public printer, he shall receive...

[No. 5.]
An Act to put an end to the corruption from military substitutes of those who have heretofore furnished substitutes.

[No. 6.]
An Act providing for the payment of the salaries of the members of the Confederate States of America.

[No. 7.]
An Act to continue in force the Act to provide for the compensation of certain persons named in the Act of the 18th of January, 1864.

[No. 8.]
An Act to authorize the appointment of a Third Auditor of the Treasury.

[No. 9.]

[No. 10.]
An Act to authorize the validation of certain Confederate States Bonds, and the substitution of others for them.
