

NOTHING. Most of the higher Courts were in session yesterday, but nothing of the slightest interest to the "general public," as the poet hath it, was transacted. After any election, Justice seems to be for a few days to enjoy her *atum cum dignitate*. She'll balance her scales anon.

THE LATE ROBBERY.—With "all the weary watching of their care-tired souls," the police have not been able to find any clue to the whereabouts of the persons who committed the robbery of J. G. Faler's store on Tuesday night last.

ATTEMPT TO KILL.—A man about 28 years of age, a German by birth we are told, named John Patza, was yesterday examined by Recorder Baldwin, for having cut the throat of Ann Williams, on the night of the 29th ult. Ann Williams is rather a good-looking woman, of middle age, but does not bear the faintest character. Yesterday she deposed, that on the night in question, the accused tapped at her window, and was admitted. He remained in her apartment, and suddenly, whilst she was reclining on her bed, he stabbed her in the throat with a large dirk-knife. Her screams and cries of "murder" awoke the neighbors, who on entering found the accused with his hands besmeared with blood, and his victim almost insensible. It is said that jealousy induced Patza to commit the crime.

On the other hand, it is alleged that his object was to rob her of a large sum of money which he knew to be in the house, and finding no other mode of effecting his intent, he resorted to the means already alluded to. The accused plead "not guilty," but the testimony was so strong that the Recorder sent him to the First District Court, under bonds of \$250.

CELEBITY.—A poor negro woman, belonging to Mr. Walton, came to the Second Municipality Police office, yesterday, and made complaint that a young man, whose name she did not know, had cruelly beaten her. Her nose had been flattened almost to the level of her face, and the blood was streaming from her mouth and nostrils. The Police have taken the necessary steps to investigate the affair.

THE MANAGER OF THE MODELS.—The Police Court was more than usually honored yesterday. Dr. Robert H. Collyer "the head and front" of the Model Artists, declared that he was fearful that a man by the name of Alexander Campbell would do him some serious bodily injury. "That the said Campbell had threatened to 'cut his throat of life,' and do divers other things too numerous to mention. The upshot of the matter seems to be that the worthy model Doctor and Mr. Campbell quarrelled in regard to some professional matters, and that the Doctor not wishing to take apartments in "another and a better world," took to the law. Recorder Baldwin, after hearing both sides, dismissed the accused—believing that Mr. C. would never be the occasion of the demise of Dr. C.

CAUGHT IN THE ACT.—Mr. Edmund Galuzes yesterday made affidavit before Recorder Ramos, that night before last he was assaulted by a man named James Rafferty, who at the same time attempted to rob him. It appears that Rafferty made an attempt to snatch his watch from his vest. Mr. C. caught him by the wrist, and gave him into the charge of the police. Rafferty was yesterday sent to the First District Court.

A WHALER.—Ellen Duguet, f. v. c., was yesterday brought before Recorder Baldwin for having grossly insulted and abused Mr. Isaac F. Stockton. Ellen gave bail in the sum of \$50 for her appearance before the First District Court.

STOLEN CLOTHING.—Lieut. Busby, of the Second Municipality Police, yesterday reported having found a large quantity of stolen clothing in the possession of Cyrus, the slave of Mr. Daniels, and Peggy, the slave of Mr. Breedlove. Cyrus, after having been placed in the stocks for a while, confessed that he did not know to whom the clothing belonged, but acknowledged that he had been in the habit of stealing every article that he could lay his hands on. He would visit the hotels, boarding-houses, and even the clothes-lines were not beyond the empire of his "genies. Hats, coats, parasols, vests, shirts," "were all fish when they came into his net." As for Peggy, when what we can learn, she was merely like that fabulous dog Tray, who was caught in bad company. Many of the articles stolen have the names and marks of the owners upon them, and those gentlemen who have lately lost clothing would do well to visit the High Constable's office and identify their "togery."

SWINDLING.—Thomas A. Carr was yesterday sent to the First District Court by Recorder Baldwin, on the charge of having swindled Mr. J. Wolcott out of the sum of \$25.

VERY UNUSUAL.—A man was arrested on Tuesday night last for using indecent and improper language to his own wife. The lady in question, not relishing the tone of conversation of her hedge-lord, had him arrested and put in quod. He, however, gave signs of repentance, and yesterday, at the request of his "lady-love," he was released by Recorder Baldwin.

New York for France. On the night of the 28th ult., there was a prodigious meeting of the citizens of New York at Lafayette Hall, Broadway. Our esteemed friend Major Noah, was put in the Chair, and many of the most eminent men of the city appointed Vice Presidents and Secretaries. Wm. C. Bryant, Theodore Lodge, Horace Greeley, and others, were chosen to draft resolutions. The following was adopted as an ADDRESS to the People of the United States.

CITIZENS.—France is again a Republic, again has placed herself under the banner of freedom, and we are called upon this evening to sympathize in her mighty efforts to establish a Free Government, and extend to her the right hand of fellowship, encouragement and confidence. France has not only King but the Lord of Hosts and the sovereign people governing in His great name. It is seventy years, friends and fellow-citizens, since France, feeling for the early struggles of our Revolutionary War, sent her armies and navies to aid us in that fearful extremity. A nation of only four millions and thirteen Colonies was in the grasp of a colossal power, until that aid arrived which enabled us to make us free and independent States; and twenty millions of people, constituting our Republic, hail with joy our sister Republic, France, who did not forget us in our extremity, but sent her Lafayette, De Grasse, and other distinguished officers and soldiers to fight our battles at Brandywine, Yorktown, and other places, under the immortal Washington. Now, that our example has forever established the fact that a Republic can be formed, properly administered, is the strongest government on earth. France, once the most powerful monarchies in Europe, has now become the most powerful of Republics; and such will be the effect, we may hope, of her present struggle, that in another half century, free Governments will prevail over the whole world, thus proving that while God gave Kings in His anger, He gave Rights to men, when he created his own image.

Let us rejoice, fellow-citizens, at this new Star of Freedom, which has so brilliantly arisen in France; and not only congratulate her on the show, but cheer her as a friend, and grant her by our example that the foundation of a Republic is a LAW and LIBERTY—LIBERTY AND LAW—AND UNIVERSALITY. We are not a free and independent government—the people obedient to the laws which they themselves have passed—freedom of the Press, of Religion, and of speech—freedom of the Ballot Box—Education and Industry—there can be no Republic permanently established. Let it hope that France, assisted by the great rights of politics, her people actively engaged in agriculture—her productive industry employed, and all her immediate wants supplied—may tranquilly succeed, as we have done, in establishing a Free Government, the admiration of the world, and which the world in arms cannot subvert.

The following are the resolutions adopted by the meeting: Resolved, That deeply impressed with the social and political evils inseparable from a corrupt and oppressive monarchy, we congratulate the French nation on a revolution which, conducted with con-

summate bravery, integrity, and wisdom, has eventuated in the establishment of a republic, the extinction of a titled aristocracy, the freedom of the press, and the principles of universal suffrage. Resolved, That the adoption, by one of the most enlightened nations of Europe, of republican institutions, which have secured the liberty and promoted the prosperity of America—constitutes a new and bright era in the world's history—sups the foundation of European thrones, sustained by the sword of arms, and imparts hope and light to the oppressed and toiling millions of Europe. Resolved, That we rejoice that the nation which shared with our patriot sires in the perils and glory of the American revolution, has been the first to establish, in the heart of Europe, its republican institutions, and that the land of Lafayette—the land of Washington—is blessed with a common freedom.

Resolved, That the political regeneration of Italy, produced by the wisdom, firmness, and energy of Pope Pius IX—followed by the overthrow of despotism in France, and the prompt recognition of republican liberty by the clergy, identifies him with the progress of civilization and free institutions, and entitles him to the respect and admiration of the world.

Resolved, That the establishment of the French Republic, and its influence on the nations of Europe, most ardently to be desired, if it leads immediately to overthrow the Government of Kings; and we sincerely hope that Ireland may secure for its oppressed people the independence essential to its social policy and political elevation.

Resolved, That a committee of thirty be appointed for the purpose of conferring and cooperating with our adopted citizens of every nation, in order to unite in a general manifestation of public sentiment on the subject of the recent events in Europe.

A committee was also appointed to take the preparatory steps for an immense mass meeting in the Park, respecting the French movement.
