LOCAL NEWS.—Yesterday morning at about 12 o'clock, there was the greatest excitement amongst the reporters for the daily newspapers about—nothing. The Delta congratulated the Crescent on his health—the Picayune shook hands with the Bee, and the Commercial Times nodded to the Bulletin. The Mercury was, as usual, courteous and industrious, and smiled on every one, and the National ditto ditto. The Courier shook the hands of all, and every thing went as merry as a marriage—no fire bell ringing at 12 o'clock on night, next door to the chamber of a man suffering with the tooth-ache.

THIRD DISTRICT COURT.—P. A. Champomier vs. J. M. Scott.—The taking of testimony in this case, which was commenced in December last, was yesterday concluded in the Third District Court.—The matter at issue in this case is the ownership of the boat which was originally owned by Champomier and a man named Brigette. Scott, who was the commander of the boat, became a purchaser of Brigette's share, and gave his notes, endorsed for \$15,000. Champomier avers that he paid all those notes, and that he is entitled to the boat, claiming the entire ownership, and to dispossess the boat who has up to the time of commencing the suit, commanded her. The defendant, Scott, avers in his answer that the aforesaid notes were paid by the earnings of the boat, thus making good his indebtedness to the bank. The court appointed accountants to examine the books of the boat, and report thereon, when a decision in this case will be given.

Some time before the watch were called in on Tuesday morning, one of the watchmen noticed a key sticking in the door of the store, and thinking it strange, opened the door and found the watchmen in the lock, and it is supposed that the burglars having entered it, were suddenly frightened away by the appearance of a watchman, and left their "open house" behind. There is hardly a night passes of us, but that an attempt, often a successful one, is made to break into some store. Our mode of proceeding has become a perfect farce, and the police have become disgusted with it. A second is now pending about in search of an opportunity to exercise his professional skill, and is arrested.

SECOND MUNICIPALITY COUNCIL.—The Council met last evening pursuant to adjournment—Recorder Baldwin in the chair. The Treasurer's Report was read and passed as follows: Balance on hand at last report, \$2,549.99; amount received since, 12,299.85; Total, 14,849.84; Balance on hand, 3,065.84.

A communication was made by the Mayor, transmitting various sealed proposals for the repair of the various engine houses, was referred to the Fire Committee. A petition was received from the German inhabitants of the Municipality, praying that the ordinance which was published in the German language, On motion of Mr. Peters, the Council resolved, first from and after this date, the ordinances of the Municipality be published in "Die Glocke," for the accommodation of the German population. A petition from fire engine company No. 17, praying the erection of a new engine house, was referred to the Fire Committee.

Mr. Peters, from the Finance Committee, made a report concerning the financial affairs of the Municipality: The report shows, that in 1847, The debt of the Municipality amounted to, \$2,671,409.29; and at a corresponding period of this year, to, 2,438,941.29.

Being a reduction of, 232,557.70; The estimated receipts for 1848, are, 1,490,055; Estimated disbursements, 1,490,055; Leaving, with \$58,000 of bills payable, a deficit of, 152,555.

The report was ordered to be printed. The committee on Streets and Landings reported a resolution instructing the Surveyor to contract with Mr. J. M. Peters for paving with round stone the Market Place, also to contract with Mr. J. M. Peters for paving the existing contract for paving St. Thomas street, so as to include Robin street, and Tchoupitoulas street and St. Thomas.
