ELECTION OF ALDERMAN.—An election was held on Saturday, in the Second Ward, First Municipality, for member of the Council, to fill the place made vacant by the resignation of Mr. O'Neill. The election resulted in the choice of Mr. William Silk, who received 108 votes out of 300.

FIRST MUNICIPALITY POLICE.—John Griffin was yesterday arrested at the request of the captain of the barque Union. The captain said that John had been insulting and threatening him. John Montgomery, Alfred Witz and John Molloy, were arrested for getting drunk and kicking up a row.

FREE SOIL MEETING.—On Saturday night, the Free Soil party of Lafayette held a meeting on the corner of Harmony and Levee streets. The meeting was organized by the appointment of Thomas G. Mackay as President, W. M. Spethen and I. Stone, Vice Presidents, and John J. Young, Secretary. The meeting was addressed by Mr. Sample and Mr. Stone, and a series of Free Soil resolutions adopted, after which the meeting adjourned.

SLAVE ARRESTED.—Seymour, a slave was yesterday arrested in the Second Municipality, at the request of a person whom he had been assaulting and otherwise abusing.

DISURRING THE PEACE.—Two highly respectable individuals joining in the names of Sandy McGee, and Place, were yesterday taken in charge by the Second Municipality police, being accused of fighting, gambling and disturbing the peace.

BROWNE.—On Saturday a Frenchman named Guillaume Savory was drowned near the Government wharf, by the upsetting of a sail boat.

John Egan and José Fernandez were arrested for insulting and abusing citizens, and committing a breach of the peace.

The person robbed suddenly disappeared and was not to be found, and the other evidence being of little moment, the accused were both discharged.

ATTEMPT TO STEAL.—Louis Francis, alias Jas. Edlington, free man of color, was on Saturday examined in the First Municipality, being charged by Henry Phillips, a watchman, with entering the alley of the grocery store of Jean Fisse, at the corner of St. Peter and Royal streets, and with attempting to force a door which led into the store. The accused was sent to the First District Court for trial. Wm. Eubanks, alias St. Louis Bill, was also sent to the First District Court for being found in the premises of Francis Buchanan, No. 21 Basin street, with the intent to steal.

JUVENILE SCANDALS.—James McAvoy, a boy only about ten years old, was on Saturday brought before Recorder Golding, at the request of his mother, as an incorrigible bad boy. This boy, young as he is, had on Friday robbed a drunken volunteer of a purse containing about \$34, consisting of a \$20 bill, a \$10 gold piece, and the rest in silver. Recorder Golding gave him a place in the house of refuge. Another boy was also brought before the same magistrate, by the name of William Kearny, who was charged with having stolen \$10 from Simon O'Driscoll. He was also sent to the house of refuge.

ROBBERY AND ATTEMPT TO KILL.—Samuel Smith was on Friday night arrested in the First Municipality, upon the above charges. Martin Falhu, a night watchman, made an affidavit before Recorder Genois, in which he stated the following facts in relation to the arrest: At about 4 o'clock in the morning, while he was on his beat of Customhouse street, he heard cries of murder proceeding from the levee, and immediately ran towards the spot. On his way he met the prisoner and another person running from the place from whence the cries proceeded. He arrested the prisoner, but the other person escaped. The deponent found a man named Henry Smith lying on the sidewalk, having received a severe wound in the head, and being covered with blood. Near the place where the wounded man lay there was money scattered about. The prisoner was immediately recognized by the wounded man as the person who inflicted the blow upon him. The hands and shirt of the prisoner were bloody when he was arrested. The wounded man was sent to the hospital. During the day, the Recorder received a certificate from Dr. Weberstrand, House Surgeon at the Charity Hospital, stating that the wounds of Henry Smith were not apparently of a mortal character, and expressing hopes of his speedy recovery. The prisoner, Samuel Smith, was, after being examined, permitted to return to his home, to await his trial before the First District Court.

CRIME IN BOSTON.—It is our painful duty to record another murder in Boston, says the Boston Post of the 9th. Brazillia Groves, of Dresden, Maine, aged 24, was stabbed in Ann street, about 11 o'clock on Monday night, the knife penetrating the abdomen seven inches towards the heart. He was carried to the house of Dr. Ayer, who considered the wound mortal. The young man was a sailor, and was going, with his brother, aboard their vessel, when they were attacked by a gang of villains, his brother knocked down, and he wounded while stooping over him. The ruffians escaped, and a blame is as that they should be able to defy the police. In one of the cellars in Ann street, on the same evening, George L. Russell, of Stoughton, was pined with liquor, perhaps by the same gang, and knocked down and robbed of a gold watch, worth \$50. In the Police Court, John Conley, charged with an attempt to shoot John Ross, with a pistol, was tried at the Municipal Court, so were William Doble, William Keith and Michael Quinn, charged with taking into an optician shop in Battery-march street, and stealing cigars and port.

A MURDER.—An old woman, nearly eighty years of age, was found on the 7th, in the western street, of Baltimore, living in a room surrounded by filth, and every evidence of abject poverty, and confined to her bed, which consisted of a more comfortable room, and on searching her effects, no less than \$25 in specie were found stowed away in old stockings, cups, etc., and a large portion of it up the chimney. Her valuables were taken possession of by the mayor, who expended a portion of it in procuring the necessary care of life, and with medical attention, the old lady seems to be improving.

NEW BUSINESS.—The good people of Nantucket have recently entered a new branch of business—no other than fishing for Sharks! About a dozen persons have captured during the last month some 100 of these fish, realizing about \$800 therefor. The fish yield each over a gallon of oil, and the carcasses bring 10 cents apiece. So says the Nantucket Mirror.
