Assault and Battery.—A man named Fowler was arrested yesterday for striking Ann Kohn on the head with a piece of wood, and gave bail to appear for examination.

Harboring a Runaway.—Andre Grass yesterday made affidavit that his slave Nelly, who runs away about a month ago, has been harbored by a "certain person" in his premises in the First Municipality, whom he can point out. A warrant was issued for the arrest of the "certain person."

SECOND MUNICIPALITY.—Dismissed.—Hiram Patterson and J. Ford, accused of assaulting John D. Burns on board the ship Manoe, were yesterday discharged, it appearing in evidence that the complainant had used highly provocative language.

The Recorder advised his protection, before appearing to the court for his intercession, to endeavor first to protect himself by refraining from the use of such grossly abusive language as it had been proven he used to Patterson and Ford.

Larceny.—Jacob Hersh was yesterday arrested on the charge of stealing from the house of Mary Ann Craus, a silver watch worth \$32.

Robbery.—The grocery store of Richard Devoe, in the Third Municipality, was entered on Thursday night by thieves, and \$120 in silver, a small lot of jewelry, a gun, and three boxes sperm candles, were stolen therefrom. An affidavit to this effect was made yesterday before Recorder Sezenau, in which he pointed out the probable place of concealment of the property, and a search warrant was issued. The robbers have not as yet been arrested.

FUGITIVE FROM JUSTICE.—The St. Louis Republic of the 20th inst. says: A woman named Mary Fanning, was arrested yesterday morning and carried before the Recorder, upon information of a citizen of Lafayette, Louisiana, who charged her with being a fugitive from justice in said State. It appears that Mary is under security for her appearance before a Criminal Court in Louisiana, to answer a charge of aiding and abetting a young girl, thirteen years of age, in a larceny. The informer is her ball, and to save himself has followed her to this place, in order to effect her arrest. Her counsel, Mr. Wright, contended that her arrest was illegal, inasmuch as the crime with which she is charged is not set forth in the complaint. The point was sustained, and Mary discharged.

THE CITY MARSHAL FROM ST. LOUIS, on the 20th inst., arrested a colored man named James Cockrell, charged with the larceny of the \$500, from Mr. Mathews, on board the steamer Edward Bates, a short time since.

THE ALABAMA OUTLAW.—The Mobile Herald of the 28th inst. says: "We learn that requisitions from the Governor of Mississippi, for the arrest of all the Copelands, and for Gates Wages and his wife, have been in the city for some time. One of the Copelands, Thomas, under one of these warrants, was carried off by the sheriff of Perry county, last week. Another, who was in custody, was discharged the day before the requisition for his translation to Mississippi came. The whole tribe, including Wages and his wife, terrified by these warrants, have gone off to Florida. We are informed that they passed over into that State several days ago by way of the Lower Peach Tree Landing, on the Alabama river. As far as the laws of this State are concerned, these ruffians seemed to be perfectly secure. For several years past they have committed a series of murders and outrages, which would have been visited any where else with prompt and condign punishment."

ARREST OF COUNTERFEITERS.—A man named William McCullough has been arrested at Norwich, (Conn.) charged with passing counterfeit \$3 bills upon the Agawan Bank, Springfield. He is stated to have passed twenty-four, while in Norwich. He is a member of a gang belonging to the borders of Vermont and Canada, and has been in Springfield and the intermediate towns, for a short time, industriously occupied in passing his spurious bills.

POLICE OFFICERS CONVICTED.—Three police officers were convicted in Philadelphia on the 19th inst., of an assault and battery upon a man whom they arrested without legal process, and without being eye-witnesses to the alleged unlawful transaction.

FIRE IN MORRISTOWN.—The large cotton lap and wadding manufactory of Joseph H. Boley & Co., in Morristown, (N. J.) was entirely destroyed by fire on the 15th. The fire broke out in the upper stories, and was undoubtedly the work of an incendiary. The loss is estimated at about \$10,000, and there was an insurance of \$6,000 upon the property.
