SPECIE.—The amount of specie in the Sub-Treasury at New York on the 30th, was \$1,400,000, inclusive of \$300,000, a special deposit.

FAILURES.—Three mercantile failures occurred in Boston on the 21st ult.

FIRST MUNICIPALITY.—But little business was transacted in Recorder Genot's Court yesterday. It being All Saints' Day, our down-town population kept it as usual a holiday, and the Recorder was but a few minutes in Court.

Compound Theft.—A man named John Coleman was seen to knock an old man down, about 3 o'clock yesterday morning, in the coffee-house of Jean Batiste Morteau, at the corner of Ursuline and Front Levee streets, and to attempt to rob him of his watch. Charles McGinley appeared against him yesterday, and Recorder Genot committed him for trial before the First District Court. While in the guard-house, a sailor found drunk on the street, was brought in and placed in the same room. The police officers neglected to search his person, and he was taken into the cell with between twenty or thirty dollars. On being waked up the money was missing and some of it was found on Coleman. The man took it, refused to prosecute, and gave his interesting room-mate a dollar "to buy grog."

Committed.—Nancy Mayfield, for assaulting Rachel Leese in her house and biting her on the arm, was sent before the First District Court.

Threatening to Take Life.—James Fanning, for threatening to take the life of Wm. G. Middleton, with a knife, on the Levee yesterday morning, was required to give security to keep the peace, which being unable to do, he was sent to prison for fifteen days.

SUPPOSED INFANTICIDE.—An infant, about two days old was found dead on the banquet, near the Old Basin, at a very early hour yesterday morning. The skull was fractured near the left temple, as if by a blow, and the supposition is that the blow was inflicted by one of the authors of the child's existence. An inquest was held on the body and a verdict returned that it had died of the wound.

SECOND MUNICIPALITY.—Death in the Watch-house.—A man named John R. McCormick was brought to the watch-house on Tuesday night, drunk, and died there yesterday. An inquest was held on the body, and a verdict returned, "Died by the visitation of God."

Committed.—John Durant alias Foucher, accused by James M. Read of stealing about \$20 worth of lumber from the corner of Smith and St. Mary's streets, was yesterday committed for trial before the First District Court. Patrick Ryan, charged with an assault and battery on Wm. McCue, was also committed for trial. Peter Matthews, accused of beating Henry Miller with a stone or some other deadly weapon, was likewise sent before the First District Court.

Harboring a Runaway.—G. A. Letourne, a white man, arrested a few days since with a colored woman named Harriet, at the request of W. M. Gwynn, who charges them with concealing and harboring a runaway slave named Harriet, was yesterday examined and sent before the First District Court. The colored woman has not yet been examined.

Larceny.—Patrick Maley was arrested on Tuesday night, charged with stealing \$62 from a Mr. Duran.

RATHER MYSTERIOUS.—A volunteer who called upon the U. S. Paymaster at Cincinnati last week for his extra pay, was found registered as "killed in battle or missing." But he had only been taken prisoner by the Mexicans, and proving his identity, he was discharged.

The Prussian government, like that of Frankfurt, has refused to recognize the Provisional Government set up in Schleswig and Holstein by the King of Denmark, under the Presidency of Count Moltke, and of which no official notification had been sent to the Court of Berlin.

Communities of free blacks are living quiet in Virginia.

Two persons, it is stated, were burnt to death on the 20th, in Woonsocket, Rhode Island.

The mandacity or ignorance of the British press, is fully exemplified in the following extract of an article in the London Times, upon Presidential elections in the United States:

"Of the seven million voters, scarcely one knows his own political creed, or has any other object than to be the vehement partisan of somebody or other, he knows not whom. It is faction without faith, and passion combined with indifference. The United States are the raw fuel for political strife, and only wait the spark that is to kindle them. What sparks political, in so much a people! How long will it be before a personal contest of extraordinary violence, or a particular adventurer more than usually unprincipled and crafty, will plunge the whole Union into civil war? In the absence of sound political views and honest political differences, there is sure to be an evil tendency to personal quarrels. Such are just the times for a Marins or a Sylla, a Pompey or a Cesar. For our sakes and for the sake of the world, we would prefer the advent of such men anywhere, and especially in the great Anglo-American Republic."

SPREADING THE GOSPEL IN MEXICO.—A note in the 28th page of the Democratic Review for October reads thus:—It is good whether true or not: It is related on irrefragable evidence, and is illustrative of character that the American Bible Society forwarded to the Army Occupation, several hundred Bibles for the use of the troops. These Bibles were, by order, used for cartridges and wadding. Some of the raw troops had conspicuous visitings in relation to ramming down cartridges into their rifles, going into battle, and their expressions of dissatisfaction having reached Gen. Taylor's ears, he rode up to a regiment at Buena Vista about to fire, and called out with an oath, "Now, then, you cowardly fellows, let us see how you can spread the gospel in Mexico." That was the last speech heard upon earth by many a gallant soul which passed to its account the conclusion which followed died upon the ear.

PRESIDENT OF HAVTI POISONED.—A dispatch from Boston, October 23, says: "Advice from Cape Haytien to the 7th instant, report that President Solage was lying dangerously sick. He is reported to have been poisoned, and has lost his speech. The island was in a quiet state."

COUNTERFEIT SOVEREIGNS.—We have been requested to caution the public against an imitation of the sovereigns now in circulation, exceedingly well calculated to impose on parties who do not exercise due care in examining the money they receive. The spurious coins appear to be composed of silver, gold, and in color and execution bears a very close resemblance to the genuine sovereign; but it is so extremely light as to be immediately detected on being weighed in the hand, and its ring is very defective. It bears the date of 1847.—Manchester Guardian.

A careful calculation raises the number of men who have been in one way or another removed from Paris or imprisoned since the 23d of June, to the enormous amount of 58,000, a full fourth of the adult male population. These men are classed under several heads of slain, prisoners, exiles and fugitives.

STRANGER COMING.—A letter was received by the last steamer, which states that the "English Government is making preparations to send out 4000 select pauper boys from Ireland, and 10,000 from England, to the settlements in Australia. The rejected papers will be quietly shipped to the United States. Some are over 2,000,000 of poor orphans, all of whom will go out to America as fast as funds can be obtained for their transportation." From another source we learn that owing to the want of employment, 4500 Swiss watch-makers are preparing to embark for New York and Philadelphia. In addition to the above, an immense number of "paragons" of Paris, some of whom are coming to the United States; some hundred have already arrived. The average of arrivals in New York for the last four months has exceeded 700 per day. Our city is full of poor stragglers. All who can go west before the river closes should be on the way. We fear there will be a most distressing time among the foreigners this winter—and to add to the trouble, the funds of the Benevolent Societies are in a less prosperous condition at these times than they have been for many years, owing to the heavy drafts that have been made during the last two years.—N. Y. Mercury.
