THE CHOLERA IN NEW YORK. - The following is the report of the New York Health officer, on the 30th, as to the cases mentioned by telegraph:

The case is that of a German, who has been two months in the United States, and arrived from Pittsburgh eight days since. He has been in intercourse with the passengers of the New York, and had taken passage for Europe in one of Messrs. Fox & Livingston's vessels, and would have sailed this day, if the attack had not prevented him."

FLIGHT OF THE POPE CONTRADICTION. - The Boston Advertiser publishes the following from the Paris Journal des Debats of Nov. 29, contradicting the rumor of the Pope's flight from Rome:

"One of the journals was in an error in announcing that the Pope had been obliged to quit Rome. The Government has received, under date of the 23d, at 3 o'clock, P. M., the following telegraphic dispatch: 'VIA VECCHIA, Nov. 23. - Rome is calm. The new Ministry has published its program, and the Pope has returned to the Vatican. The Journal des Debats of the 30th contains no later intelligence from Rome. It publishes official dispatches from the French Ambassador to the 18th.'
