Supreme Court of Louisiana.

Condensed Decisions—NEW ORLEANS, May 21, 1849.

Where a party has taken the benefit of the insolvent laws, a suit to annul a judgment confessed by such insolvent is fraud of creditors, and his insolvency, must be established by the creditors of such insolvent.

BANK OF KENTUCKY vs. SARAH CONNER, ET AL. Appeal from the Fifth District Court of New Orleans. On the 6th May, 1846, a judgment was rendered in the Fifth District Court of New Orleans, in the case of Sarah Conner, I. W. C., vs. Theophilus Freeman, by which it was decreed that the plaintiff was entitled to her freedom, and that the defendant emancipate her, according to the formalities required by law.

Per Curiam: To the observations of counsel, that the only object of the plaintiff in bringing this suit was to vindicate her character, it is sufficient to answer that the action itself is a right of property, and that she should have brought herself within the rules prescribed for that class of actions.
