

NEW ORLEANS MARKETS.

CHERRY ORANGE. - The past week has been a duller one for business even than that which preceded it, and the inactivity has extended throughout nearly every branch of trade.

COTTON - Throughout the early part of the week the cotton market was inactive, as parties were disinclined to operate until in possession of the Niagara's accounts.

TOBACCO - The inquiry has been less active and buyers have been holding off with the expectation of obtaining lower rates.

GRAIN - As the arrivals of corn have not exceeded the demand, prices have been well sustained and sales of nearly 20,000 sacks have been made.

COFFEE - The market for Rio has improved a little and 300 sacks have been taken at 6 1/2c, mainly, though including some small lots at 6 1/4c.

WHEAT - The Whisky market has been rather firmer, and some 1200 bbls. of whisky have been sold at 1 1/2c, and related as to a few days ago.
