MAILS.—The Postmaster General has given a notice in the Northern papers, in regard to the mails for the Pacific. The details are that mails may be sent to New York, Charleston, S. Carolina; Savannah, Georgia; and New Orleans, Louisiana; to be conveyed by the "Falcon," which will sail from New York on the 29th instant; from Charleston on the 1st July next; from Savannah on the same day, (evening); and from New Orleans, to be conveyed by the steam packet "Isthmus," leaving that port (New Orleans) direct for Chagres on the 11th of July next. Mail bags should be made up at New York and at the other points named for Chagres, Panama, San Diego, Santa Barbara, Monterey, San Francisco, and Astoria. It is added that the entire postage for a single letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, will be 12 cents to Havana, 20 cents to Chagres, 30 cents to Panama, to be prepaid in all cases; and 40 cents to San Diego, Santa Barbara, Monterey, San Francisco, or Astoria, to be prepaid or sent unpaid at the option of the sender. Newspapers and pamphlets sent postage three cents each, and inland postage is added.

THIRD DISPATCH

FRANCE.—The ultra-radicals have from 210 to 240 members of the new French Assembly. The general amnesty bill has been lost by only 5 votes. The Duke D'Aumale has been elected to the Assembly, but being under sentence of exile cannot sit. The new Assembly convened on the 28th. (Here follows a part of the dispatch which we cannot exactly comprehend, but we take the meaning of it to be that there has been a great commotion in the Assembly, produced by some offensive expression of the President of that body; that the excitement was great, and there was danger of a mob; that Ledru-Rollin was concerned in the affair; that four Secretaries resigned, and many members were about to leave the chamber, when the President retracted the offensive remarks, and tranquility was restored. This is all we can make out of it.)

THE FRENCH IN ITALY.—At the last accounts the French army had not entered Rome. The troops showed evident signs of sympathy with the Romans. The negotiations proposed by the French Ambassador had failed. The Romans refused the French army permission to enter the city either as friends or enemies. Oudinot's troops are exposed to the malaria, and disaffection is rapidly extending among them.

The Murder Case

Total of Capt. Joseph Bradley for the Murder of Fanny Young alias Fanny Laly.

FIRST DISTRICT COURT.—JUDGE McHENRY PRESIDING.

The prisoner, Joseph Bradley, late Captain of the schooner Fremont, was brought into Court yesterday morning to answer to a charge of the murder of Fanny Young, a girl of some seventeen years of age.

The prisoner was plainly but neatly attired, in a light summer suit, and seemed to be a man of thirty-eight or forty years of age. The loss of his right eye was an unpleasant expression of his face, but he wore a pair of spectacles, and his countenance, under the influence of a determined, earnest, and quick and lively nature.
