NEW ORLEANS: THURSDAY MORNING, JULY 11, 1850.

FIRST DISTRICT COURT.—The State vs. J. B. Chandler. This case was tried yesterday, and resulted in the acquittal of the prisoner. This young man was tried more than a year ago, and under the illegal charge of the late Judge, he was convicted of manslaughter and sentenced to the Penitentiary for twenty years. He took an appeal to the Supreme Court on the charge of the Judge, who remanded the cause with instructions to charge as directed by the Grand Jury.

The charge of Judge Larn was a just exposition of the law as recognized in the celebrated case of Sellridge. The Jury were not out ten minutes. The result has been an acquittal. This young man has been unjustly confined in the parish jail for more than a year, owing to the mistakes of a Judge, Counsel for the prisoner, Randall Hunt and J. W. Frost—for the State, M. M. Reynolds. The Mayor's Court of the Second Municipality met yesterday morning—the Recorder presiding, and assisted by Aldermen Hale and Hooper. J. M. Wolf objected to the trial of W. D. Ainsworth, charged with vagrancy, because there was no Clerk. He maintained that the Clerk must be chosen by the people, and that the appointment by the Council of a person to be incumbent was illegal and void. That the Court was a Court of Clerk, and could not proceed. Mr. Reese, the District Attorney, replied by quoting the section which gives the Court "all incidental powers to enforce its jurisdiction and carry out the intent and design of the act." Under this he said the Court had a right to appoint its Clerk—the statute being silent on that point.

Mr. Frost said that the Court was one in whose opinion and actual operation the public felt a deep interest, and that the Court was one in whose opinion and actual operation the public felt a deep interest. He would engage, for the sake of argument, that the present incumbent had been illegally appointed; yet he said the Clerk de facto and could only be removed by a direct action in the form of an inquest of office. The decisions were so numerous, and the point so well established, that it was no longer deemed an open question. The acts of this officer de facto were recognized from public policy, and he was not to be treated as a usurper. The decision would be in favor of the Clerk de facto. The Court could go on with perfect safety, and leave the question to be settled by an independent act.

The Court determined to suspend its decision for the present. Mr. Reese then called the case of Ainsworth, when Mr. Wolfe moved to quash the information, because filed in the name of Isaac Johnson, the Attorney General. He read from the section appointing the District Attorney as the person to file the information, not having been filed in the name of the District Attorney. The Court sustained his motion, but would have been engaged in his long argument, the District Attorney had written out a new information in his own name. This he filed, and Ainsworth was arrested instantly. This led to quite an exciting debate, when the Recorder said he had determined to hear no more argument, and in spite of the protestations of counsel, he adjourned the Court to the next term. So our new Court, which was so much for the safety of the city, is laid up for a month.

A REVOLVING CASE.—On Sunday last an advertisement appeared in the "Picayune," stating that a young girl named Rebecca Robinson, aged sixteen years, had mysteriously disappeared from her home. The girl belongs to a poor but respectable Polish family, who have resided in this city for some years, and measures were instantly taken to trace out her fate. To the horror of her family it has been found that she had been inveigled away by a colored man named Jambert, who it is stated, has secured her in a house in the suburbs. Yesterday the Rev. Mr. Laughlin was arrested on the charge, preferred by the Rev. Mr. Laughlin, of stealing property from the burning building. A number of articles were found in his possession. He was brought up yesterday before Recorder Rousseau, and was sent before the First District Court on the charge of larceny. He will be further examined upon the more serious complaint.
