In regard to the Indian difficulties, and rumors of Indian wars, the Alta California says: "As we intimated, the Indian troubles at Mariposa do not seem to have been, nor to be, nor promise to be, of a very dangerous tendency. It is extremely doubtful, indeed, if any intention exists on the part of any of the tribes to war upon the whites, farther than a temporary feeling of anger, which may be induced by some accident, which, we think, the Indian Commissioner will be able to settle. In connection, we wish to caution the public not to believe any of the rumors which they are hearing, and which, in California, are not without exception, are of the most peaceable character, not infrequently being the result of some accident, and not at all fitted for its purposes by habits of the nation. If any impediment to a lasting condition of peace between the two nations exist, it may only be the result of some accident, and not of any intention on the part of either nation to war upon the other."
