Wild Cat - The Camanches. The Republic of the 15th instant, publishes a memorandum of a conversation between Wild Cat, or Coancho, and Col. Cooper and Temple, at Eagle Pass, Texas, on the 27th March, 1881.

Accidental Death - An inquest was held, yesterday, on the body of a male man named, aged about forty years, belonging to Mr. Reager, of Texas Parish. He was employed on the board of the steamer Dr. Hart, lying opposite to Canal street, on Monday night last, when he fell from the after hatchway, and so injured himself by striking the side of the hatch as he fell, that he died shortly after. The jury returned a verdict in accordance with the facts.

Alterations in Recorder Caldwell's Court - Workmen were engaged yesterday in altering and re-arranging the fittings of the Court of the Recorder of the Second Municipality. The alterations on which his Honor is seated, is better for the transaction of business, and will be a much greater space for the accommodation of the public. We hope the reporters' table will be put in front, and not behind the witness stand.

Breach of Trust - Yesterday Victor St. Victor was put upon his trial in the First District Court, before Judge Laro, on a charge of having committed a breach of trust on the Louisiana Bank.

M. M. Reynolds, Esq., District Attorney, prosecuted the case, and J. P. Benjamin, Esq., defended the prisoner. The evidence was very long, and the Court occupied with the case from about eleven o'clock in the morning until three in the afternoon. It appeared that St. Victor had been in the employ of the Bank for a number of years, and in January last was a teller in the establishment. On the 23d of that month he discovered to be a defaulter, and told his superior, and he was discharged the next morning, but instead of going to the bank, took a quantity of money, and departed with it. On an inquiry being instituted, it was found that upwards of \$71,000 was missing, and affidavits were made against him for breach of trust. On the 25th of January, between 11 o'clock and night, some persons, on behalf of Mr. St. Victor, called on Mr. Reynolds, and called on the bank, and the sum of \$51,000, and said Mr. St. Victor had not taken more than that money. This left \$20,000 dollars, which he was charged with having appropriated to his own use. The money consisted of fourteen one hundred dollar bills, a number of old ten and cancelled notes, which were to have been replaced, as well as a number of other bills, and a check for \$60,000 dollars, which was part of the default.

In defense, witnesses were called to speak to his character, and they proved that he had been known for upwards of forty years as a man of irreproachable character, and Benjamin addressed the jury, and he testified that the default in the accounts arose from the fact that the money was not paid to him, but that he had been entrusted with it, and he had no intention to defraud the bank. The Judge summed up the case, and charged the jury, who retired at a little before three o'clock, and as they did not appear likely to come in until half an hour, he adjourned the court until 10 o'clock.

In about three hours after an intimation was given that the jury had agreed upon a verdict, a messenger was dispatched for Judge Laro. On his arrival at a few minutes past five o'clock, the jury came into court, and returned a verdict of not guilty, upon which Mr. St. Victor was discharged.

Recorder Caldwell's Court - A man named J. W. Buck was fined \$2 for making a disturbance on Cicou street, at 12 o'clock on Monday night, and another named Watchman Callahan in the case of the same street, at 12 o'clock on Monday night. Staling Tax - John Walker was brought up on a charge of stealing three pounds of tea, on Monday night. He was observed between 9 and 10 o'clock, going along Triton Walk with the tea in his possession, and not being able to account satisfactorily to the watchman as to how he obtained it, he was taken into custody. While the case was proceeding, Archibald McNeil, Captain of the volunteer fire company, identified the tea as having been stolen from his vessel by the prisoner, who was engaged as a laborer on board. Sent to the First District Court.

Vagrancy - Hugh Garland, alias Gallagher, was arrested for being a vagrant and not following any honest occupation. He was seen lurking about Gray street by a watchman, who took him to the Watch-house at about 10 o'clock at night. A question for the day was whether he had obtained his living by chicken fighting, which he had followed three weeks, and he had lived in this city eleven years. His Honor said he should have made many friends in that time, and he should remain him for a voucher.

Gambling Extraordinary - Three men named Thomas Collins, Chas. Knox, and Edward Martin, were charged with having robbed Edmund Martin of \$150. It appears that on the 16th of this month, Martin, who had come down the river with a flat boat, met the prisoners on the Levee. They persuaded him to go along with them, and succeeded in getting him to gamble with a number of balls, and before they had done with him, took one hundred and fifty dollars, his property. They were remanded.

Stealing Money - Betsy Rice was brought up in the custody of the police, and charged with stealing a purse, the property of G. D. Bradford, amounting to \$125. It appears that the prisoner was a boarder in the house of Mrs. Sarah E. Bloom, at No. 73 Julia street, and on Sunday last he had a variegated colored purse under the pillow of his bed, in which was a \$100 bill of the Northern Bank of Kentucky, and a bill of \$20 of the same bank, with the name of 'Hutchins & Co., Louisville,' marked on the face of it. On going up to look for the purse he could not find it, and on circumstances connected with the case, he had reason to suppose that the prisoner stole it. He had hidden it in a house at the corner of Camp and Duplantier streets. An ineffectual search was made in this house for the purse yesterday morning, but nothing concerning the robbery was discovered. The girl, who has been a servant denied all knowledge of the robbery, but she was remanded to give time for further investigation.

Recorder Genoa's Court - Yesterday, the proceedings in the above court were uninteresting. Two affidavits were made in cases of assault, and several men were summarily dealt with for getting drunk and disturbing the peace. Joseph Brunson was fined \$5 for depositing a quantity of refuse on a vacant lot at the corner of St. Ann and Roman streets, contrary to existing ordinances of the Municipality, on Monday last. The draymen and cab drivers who were arrested for driving noisily through the streets, near the First District Court, were discharged by order of Judge Laro.

Rhode Island - Congressional Election - The votes for Members of Congress were counted by a Committee of the Legislature, and Benjamin B. Thurston, democrat, declared elected in the Western District, by about 100 majority; and George G. King, whig, in the Eastern, by 114 majority.
