"The Cleopatra" Indictments. On the 21st inst., Mr. J. L. O'Sullivan, Major Sleisinger and Capt. Lewis, appeared together to their recognizances in the U. S. District Court in New York, indicted on a charge of being engaged in fitting out an expedition for the invasion of Cuba.

Mr. O'Sullivan remarked, on the District Attorney's inquiry if they were prepared to plead, that the bill of indictment was very voluminous, and that he had not been able to procure a copy of it. He moved a removal of the case for trial from the U. S. District Court to the Circuit Court, at New Orleans, on the ground that the law was not settled, and that the case was one of great importance.

The District Attorney opposed the motion, chiefly because there are a number of witnesses in the case who are detained in prison, and who are not likely to be available for trial in New Orleans. He also objected to the removal on the ground that the law was not settled, and that the case was one of great importance.

The District Court granted the motion, and the case was removed to the Circuit Court at New Orleans. The District Attorney has appealed from this decision to the Supreme Court.
